In Jesus' name, amen.


A MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR AND BOARD

In Hebrews 12 we are instructed to "run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith." At CSC, our mission is to introduce people to Jesus and help them become His devoted followers, but the world around us offers many distractions. If you take a moment to reflect, it likely won't take you very long to come up with three or four things that, in your weaker moments, might divert you from your focus on Christ and His calling for our lives. Our desire is that everything that happens at the five campuses of Centre Street Church – every moment of prayer, every note of music, every word of teaching – would encourage people as they pursue God. This powerful event held special meaning for one participant, who said, "The conference in May was life changing for both my wife and me. We had been struggling within our marriage and were having a tough time communicating. For some unknown reason, I seemed unable to share what I was truly feeling. During the Wednesday night session God started to work in my heart. After the session some pastors started to pray with me and for me. God showed up and broke through some of the major walls that had built up in my life. God revealed to me that even though my life before Jesus was really bad, that didn't mean I couldn't experience all of the goodness he had for me. The following day my wife and I left on a trip for our wedding anniversary, during that trip God continued to work in my heart and fully restore our relationship!"

"It's been awesomely overwhelming to see how this group of girls has grown so massively from grade seven to grade nine," says Janet, a volunteer leader in Youth Ministry. "These girls are opening up to friends about the power of their faith. They invite friends to youth, one girl started a Bible study at her school, and over half of them serve in Children's ministry, so they're building relationships with people younger than themselves."

"Jesus said, 'Come and see' and He invited people to and see where He was living, and because of that simple invitation, their lives were changed forever," says Laurie-Lynn, as she reflects on how powerful a simple invitation can be. Laurie-Lynn and her husband David felt challenged to ask the people around them to join them at Alpha or small groups or, most important, on the path to follow Jesus. "I just can't say enough about the joy you get when someone else starts to follow Jesus," Laurie-Lynn says.

From serving those affected by the war in Ukraine through our partner agencies to supporting new Canadians in Calgary and area, from missions trips in Canada and around the world to sharing the gospel in the streets and alleys of Calgary through Monday Night Evangelism, the people of Centre Street Church are seriously taking up the mission to introduce people to Jesus and show God's love to the world.

The work of mission is absolutely worthwhile. As David says, "It can be kind of scary inviting an atheist into your church, but if you really care about that person, it's something you have to do." He adds, "We've never had an invitation not be accepted. Once we started to actually believe that Jesus is who He says He is, we realized how important it is that other people know too."

Janet's youth are showing us the power of pursuing relationship. By pursuing relationships we foster spiritual growth, build community and share the transformative power of God's love. Whether it's a brief chat on the way into a weekend service, or a deep conversation shared in a missional community, Centre Street Church wants to be a place where relationships can begin and grow.

Alpha is another place where conversation happens and relationships deepen. As one participant said, "I feel our time in Alpha helped me to reconnect meaningfully, not only with core elements of the gospel, but also in relationship-building with other like-minded and like-hearted individuals through the sharing of testimonies and personal stories, which all contributed to an enhanced relationship with Jesus. My wife started Alpha somewhat reluctantly but with a spark of curiosity and has completed the course an entirely changed woman who is desirous for the daily study of the Word and praying for others who require healing."

"Youth need people speaking truth and encouragement into their lives. My mentors taught me this in my youth when they looked past my faults. When you're real and authentic, people hear the message, and there's no greater message than the salvations of Jesus," says Jason, a youth leader who has led the same group of boys for several years. Over the years, Jason's generosity with his time has rubbed off on the boys, as they go out into the community to serve by giving Christmas hampers

At Centre Street Church, pursuing simplicity isn't about taking a vow of poverty or even about trying to avoid saying "yes" to a lot of activities – it's about being clear on the mission and purpose to which God has called us and saying an emphatic "no" to the things that don't lead us into a deeper relationship with Jesus and inviting other people to do the same. The good news is that when we say "no" to the distractions, we have the freedom to say "yes" to the good things that God wants to do in our lives and, through us, in the lives of the people around us.

Pursuing simplicity can show up in big ways; we can choose to go on a missions trip to share the gospel with people who haven't heard about Jesus rather than taking a traditional vacation. We can decide that to live in a smaller house in order to give more to people in need. Simplicity may even look like buying a bigger house to use for hospitality. It can also show up in small ways – deciding to put aside the television remote to spend time with a friend or leaving work a few minutes early to drop off a meal for someone who has been recently bereaved.

We serve a God Who is generous and has provided us with many good things. Simplicity frees us to enjoy the very best of what God has to offer through healthy relationships and generosity made possible because of reduced distractions and clear focus.

to those in need. The result is a band of brothers who are one link in a chain of generosity.

Centre Street Church provides many opportunities for people to practice generosity – whether it's generosity of time by serving in ministry areas like children's and youth ministry, or generosity with money by giving sacrificially to the work of the good news of the gospel in Calgary and area and around the world.

The expansion at Central Campus allows new ways to be generous – creating the room needed for sports ministries, learning and providing a new home for the Centre for the City, which includes our ministries to new Canadians and those with compassionate needs.
