The <u>Cubbies Alphabet Activity Book</u> provides fun activities while helping Cubbies learn and recognize letters of the alphabet. In addition, Cubbies will be learning precious truths about God, Jesus, and the Bible. Each letter focuses on a single biblical truth. You will discover many ways you can use the *Cubbies Alphabet Activity Book* to enhance your club ministry. Several suggestions are listed below.

Pre-club

When Cubbies arrive at club, they should be directed to a planned pre-club activity. Choose a page each week that coordinates with the Scripture or theme of Story Time. Use it to focus Cubbies' attention and thoughts on spiritual things.

Story Time

Create interest by blending active learning into Story Time. Show Cubbies the activity page that they will be completing during the meeting. Explain how it reinforces the Bible story the Cubbies have heard.

Book Time

Use an activity sheet as an "table activity" to motivate Cubbies during Book Time. When Cubbies have completed the section they prepared for club, allow them to complete an Alphabet Activity sheet. Use this valuable time to interact personally with your Cubbies and help them understand spiritual truths.

Game Time


An Alphabet Activity sheet makes a great "cool down" for Cubbies during the last half of Game Time. These "quiet activities" help Cubbies and leaders transition into "Going-home Time."

Building Bridges to the Home . . .

No time to complete alphabet activities in club? Take advantage of a great opportunity. As parents pick up their Cubbies from club, give them a copy of an Alphabet Activity sheet to complete as a family activity. You can also use the activity sheet as a newsletter. Periodically include club news and notes to parents on the reverse side of the sheet.

Cubbies are just beginning to develop basic perceptions about God, Jesus, and the Bible. It is important for them to understand the Scriptures in the simplest terms available. Our goal at Awana is to provide quality materials that will help young children clearly understand spiritual truths. To make understanding easier, many Scriptures included in this activity book are partial verse quotations; all are from the *King James Version* of the Bible. When necessary, words have been inserted in brackets to improve understanding.

We invite you to make as many copies of each page of this publication as needed for your Awana Cubbies Club.




A is for all.

For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23).









D is for day.


This is the *day* which the Lord hath made; we will rejoice and be glad in it (Psalm 118:24).







F is for forgive.

...the Son of Man [Jesus] hath power on earth to *forgive* sins... (Mark 2:10).









K is for kind.

...be ye [you] kind one to another... (Ephesians 4:32).




L is for **love**.

...if God so loved us, we ought also to *love* one another (1 John 4:11).




M is for made.

I will praise Thee [God]: for I am fearfully and wonderfully *made...* (Psalm 139:14).




is for **neighbor.**

...Thou [you] shalt love thy [your] neighbor as thyself [yourself] (Galatians 5:14).




O is for **obey**.


Children, obey your parents in all things: for this is well pleasing unto the Lord (Colossians 3:20).


R is for rainbow.

...God said..."I do set My [rain] bow in the cloud..." (Genesis 9:12-13).




S is for sing a song.

...sing praises unto His [God's] name; for it is pleasant (Psalm 135:3b).




I is for teaching.

...Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching... (Matthew 9:35).




U is for **us**.

...God...loved *us*, and sent His Son [Jesus]... (1 John 4:10).




V is for **voice**.

...The Lord our God will we serve, and His *voice* will we obey (Joshua 24:24).





W is for world.
